

VOCATION CORNER

This Second Sunday of Advent the Church invites us to reflect on the person of St. John the Baptist. St. John the Baptist stands in a privileged place among the prophets as one who "prepares the way



of the Lord" to reign in the hearts of God's people. He also stands in a privileged place in relationship to Jesus and is often referred to as the "friend of the Bridegroom." Jesus is of course the Bridegroom and his Bride is the Church.

A priest once shared that one of the reasons he loves being a priest is that he helps to bring a soul and Jesus together. Have you ever thought of the priest as more than just friends with Jesus? What about the priest as Jesus' best man bringing souls and Jesus together? Seeing the priesthood through the icon of St. John the Baptist we have a glimpse into the identity of the priest as one who facilitates an encounter, as one who "prepares the way of the Lord" to reign in the hearts of his people. The priesthood, in the image of St. John the Baptist as best man, helps others fall in love with Jesus over and over again. What a gift!
