Was held on Wednesday, April 14, 2021 at 7:00pm only those getting their confirmation and their immediate family were able to attend due to Covid-19.

First Holy Communion

Was celebrated on May 1, 2021 for 28 children from both St. John school and parish receiving the blessed sacrament. The ceremony was lovely and was limited (due to Covid-19) for the children, their parents and siblings only, extra seating in the school auditorium was provided to watch the event via live stream.



Although the CDA couldn't be there in person to host a reception for them, we were still able to provide a special gift for each child. Father placed the gifts at the end of each pew and announced that they were from our dear Catholic Daughters to commemorate their special day.

Inside each bag was a mass book (with a label placed inside from our court, a scapular and rosary in a velvet bag with a First Holy Communion medal all blessed by Father George. Also included were white paper crosses embedded with seeds that the children could plant with a note attached "Growing in God's Love", a white (pull) bow to hang on their doors so that as parishioners drove thru town they would know something special happened in the life of that child today. We were able to provide individually wrapped cookies (from Dolce Vita Bakery) for the children to enjoy since we could not provide an in-person cookie reception.

The North American College

Formation of men for the Priesthood of Jesus Christ at the Pontifical North American College is characterized by the four pillars of priestly formation as described in human, spiritual, intellectual and academic development. There are about 160 seminarians, as well as numerous faculty members and graduate students, from across the United States, Canada and Australia who devote themselves to personal formation for priestly ministry under the attentive guidance, supervision and evaluation of a formation faculty of priests and religious.

Catholic Relief Services

In 1943 this international project was started to provide assistance to the people in the poorest parts of the world. CRS reaches out to more than 100 countries with support such as food, medical supplies and religious assistance.

Apostleship of the Sea

In 1920 Port Ministry was conceived. Its goal is to provide spiritual, physical, and psychological services to seamen at port locations in the United States. They are always happy to receive gifts and useful articles to place on board ships in ports at Christmas time.

Covenant House

Covenant House was founded 38 years ago with the mission to help homeless kids. Today, Covenant House is the largest privately-funded agency in the Americas providing food, shelter, immediate crisis care, and essential services to homeless, throwaway, and runaway kids.

Mother Teresa

On October 7, 1950, Mother Teresa received permission from the Holy See to start her own order, "The Missionaries of Charity", whose primary task was to love and care for those persons nobody was prepared to look after. In 1965 the Society became an International Religious Family by a decree of Pope Paul VI.
